LIST OF PRIVACY RIGHTS

Depending on your jurisdiction and that of the CNH controller, you may exercise certain privacy rights to your Personal Data, among these your:

- Right to Access (Know), which entitles the data subject to have access to and information about the personal data that a controller has concerning them.
- Right to Erasure (Deletion), which is the right to have personal data erased. This is also known as the 'right to be forgotten'.
- **Right to Rectification (Correction)**, which is the right of data subjects to have any inaccurate personal information held about them by a business updated to be accurate.
- Right to Restrict Processing, which means that an individual can limit the way that an organization uses their data.
- Data Portability, which allows individuals to obtain and reuse their personal data for their own purposes across different services. It allows them to move, copy or transfer personal data easily from one IT environment to another in a safe and secure way, without affecting its usability.
- Right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing, including profiling, which produces legal effects concerning him or her or similarly significantly affects him or her.
- Right to Object, which is the right of a data subject to demand a business not process their personal data.
- Right to Withdraw Consent, which is that any data subject shall have the right to withdraw his or her consent at any
 time
- Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority, which is that a data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervising authority if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data relating to them is in violation of the applicable data privacy law.
- **Right to Opt Out of Direct Marketing,** which provides that a person may request that the business stop using your Personal Data to directly market to you, whether by email, phone, mail, fax or other means.
- Right to Opt Out of "Selling" or "Sharing" of your Personal Data, which provides that a person may request that businesses stop selling or sharing your personal information, as defined under applicable law.
- **Right to Limit the Use of Your sensitive Personal Data**, which provides that a person can direct businesses to only use your sensitive Personal Data (for example, your social security number, financial account information, your precise geolocation data, or your genetic data) for limited purposes, such as providing you with the services you requested.
- **Right to Confirmation of the Existence of Processing**, which entitles the data subject the right to get confirmation that processing of their Personal Data is occurring by a controller.
- **Right to Information About Data Shared**, which entitles the data subject the right to information about public and private entities with which the controller has shared Personal Data
- Right to Understand Consent, which entitles the data subject the right to information about the possibility of denying consent and the consequences of such denial
- **Right to Request Processing Compliance**, which entitles a data subject to information in relation to the processing of the Data Subject's own Personal Data, and whether such data is processed in line with the specified purposes
- **Right to request indemnification,** which entitles the data subject the right to request indemnification in the event that the data subject has incurred damages due to the illegal processing of Personal Data
- Right to Request Notification of erasure, rectification and correction actions taken per your request, which entitles the data subject a notification that an action was taken by the CNH controller to third parties, to whom your personal data is transferred by the CNH controller, per a submitted privacy request by the data subject.
- Right to de-index online search results, which entitles the data subject the right to de-index online search results containing sensitive Personal Data, Personal Data about a child, excessively detailed Personal Data and inaccurate, outdated, incomplete, irrelevant or misleading Personal Data
- **Right to Nominate,** which entitles the data subject the right to nominate another individual who will exercise the Data Subject's rights in the event of the Data Subject's death or incapacity

You may have other rights provided for by applicable data privacy laws. As conferred by applicable data privacy laws, you also have the right to not receive discriminatory treatment by us for the exercise of your privacy rights.
